It's Deaf Awareness Month! As the American Sign Language and English Secondary School, we take pride in shining a light on the staff members and students that are a part of the Deaf community and creating comradery between both communities by working together to support one another. Deaf Awareness Month was celebrated for the first time in 1951-70 years ago!-and the goal was to create annual events to increase awareness of and advocacy for D/deaf and Hard-of-Hearing people.

On top of Deaf Awareness Month, International Week of the Deaf is also in September! This year, it was the week of September 20th- 26th. IWD was first celebrated in 1958, also to increase awareness and advocacy, but on an international level. Each day of IWD has a different topic that is focused on and various events based on the topic. This year's schedule was:
