Friday, January 21st was Superhero Spirit Day. Students and staff dressed as their favorite superheros and villains.








BLACK HISTORY MONTH

February 2022

Each February, the United States celebrates Black History Month. It expanded to a month-long celebration in 1976 after it started as a week-long celebration in 1926. Carter G. Woodson, a historian, founded the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History (ASNLH) in 1925 and his goal was to raise awareness of the contributions of Black Americans. While progress has been made toward the American ideal of equality, it is important to note that in 2022 we still have more work to do. (Source)

As we celebrate Black History Month, "47" wants to highlight the history of the Black Deaf community. Black Deaf Americans were not allowed to learn at Deaf schools because of slavery and segregation. While the American School for the Deaf was founded in Hartford, CT in 1817, the first education for Black Deaf students only came about in the 1850s. Even the National Association of the Deaf (NAD) prohibited Black membership until 1965. Despite and perhaps because of these adversities, Black Deaf Americans developed Black American Sign Language, a dialect of ASL which uses more two-handed signs, a higher location and broader signing space, and more repetition. Even after integration of white and Black Deaf students (as late as 1978 in Louisiana), Black ASL and Black Deaf culture continue to evolve and grow today.
