Several teachers dressed as Barbie, pictured below.





OYSTER AND HYDROPONICS CLUB

This year brings some exciting new additions to our science curriculum. Thanks to a grant by NY Sun Works, and a partnership with the Billion Oyster Project, we now have a fully functioning hydroponics lab for growing plants and two oyster tanks in room 312.



The new Hydroponics elective, AP Bio course and Living Environment classes will all get to take advantage of these new resources. We also host a Hydroponics/Oyster club every Thursday from 3:15 to 4:15 for students who want to grow some food and monitor the oysters more regularly.



So far in Hydroponics club, students have begun to grow vegetables such as lettuce, basil, kale and Swiss chard. In the last month these plants have sprouted and grown while students monitor the progress and started transplanting some to larger pots. Recently, the hydroponics class held a Harvest Festival, where they harvested and brought home some of the crops they grew.



Meanwhile in oyster club students are monitoring the oyster tanks weekly, measuring their growth, and testing the quality of the tank water. The oysters are fed a daily dose of algae, and need semi frequent water changes when waste builds up in the tank. Students have also found various other critters in the tank living among the oysters such as bristle worms and amphipods, which they looked at under the microscopes.

HUDSON RIVER PARK FIELD TRIP



The Oyster and Hydroponics club recently took a field trip to the Hudson River Park at pier 40 to attend their "release the fishes" event, at which they close down their wet lab, a rotating research aquarium that is open to the public during the summer months, and return all the species back into the river.

There were educational activities such as a species scavenger hunt, microscopes with sample slides, various tanks and Hudson River staff ready to teach fun fish facts, a touch tank with oysters, spider crabs, snails etc, and of course the highlight of the event, when students each got to release a fish into the Hudson River. Refreshments were served; empanadas and cannoli, and a good time was had by all.

Have you seen the library lately? Our newly redesigned school library is an exciting multi use space that encourages students to learn and explore. Open and inviting, the library fosters communication and collaboration. 


Comic Relief- Deaf Awareness Month (September)
